- ◆ **224 Public and private colleges and universities in Illinois**
- ◆ **12 Public university campuses** enrolled 205,023 students in fall 2010
- ◆ **48 Community colleges** enrolled 379,736 students in fall 2010
- ◆ **99 Private not-for-profit colleges and universities** enrolled 230,384 students in fall 2010
- ◆ **31 Private for-profit institutions** enrolled 91,797 students in fall 2010
- ◆ **34 Out-of-state institutions** enrolled 17,811 students in fall 2010
- ◆ **924,751 students** enrolled in fall 2010
 - ⇒ Male students 401,113
 - ⇒ Female students 523,638
